

Nottinghamshire/City ISHS appointments

General: These clinics are run by doctors/specifically trained Drs/nurses to offer services for most STI and contraception care. This includes anyone who has symptoms, needs treatment for an infection, cryotherapy (freezing of warts), coil removal/review, PEP, sexual assault, emergency contraception, or is a contact of an STI. In some clinics they can also give PrEP (mainly in the hubs).

Asymptomatic: HCA/nurse led (usually) lists for people with **no symptoms**, and who do not need any treatment/examination/PrEP/PEP/contraception/vaccinations and are not a contact of an STI. They will have an STI screen ONLY. **Over 16s** unless in a specific under 25s clinic at VHC only.

Contraception: pills, patches, ring, depo injection, out of date coil/implant (**not LARC procedures/coil problems**), emergency contraception. Can also have asymptomatic screen in same appointment. Not for any examinations.

LARC: will specify if for implants or coils. ONLY for Nottm/shire residents and ONLY for contraception need. If patients from out of area are struggling to get an appointment, we will see them, but ideally they should be diverted to their local clinic/GP. Can have an asymptomatic screen in this appointment.

Hybrid LARC implant: These clinics are for implant removals/fits/replacements, but also patients with symptoms/need PEP/emergency contraception/STI treatment/contact of an STI/PrEP. They are essentially a mix of general and implant LARC. **NO COILS.** Worksop/Retford only

Hybrid mixed LARC: These clinics are for implants and coils (fits/removals/replacements) plus any other contraception or STI care. They are a mix of both LARCs plus general and can manage most things STI and contraception related. Worksop/Retford only.

General STI list: These clinics are for STI care - symptomatic, need STI testing/treatment, contact of an STI, post assault, PEP, PrEP. **NO CONTRACEPTION.** Worksop/Retford only

Contraception and implant: These clinics are a mix of contraception and implant procedures (fit/removal/replacement). **NO COILS, NO STI CARE.** Worksop/Retford only

Under 25s: anyone who is aged 24 and under can attend for asymptomatic screening, symptomatic testing, STI treatment, routine and emergency contraception. There are pre-booked and walk in options. VHC only

Health advisor treatment lists: no direct booking from contact centre. Booked by HAs after a positive result, for treatment and partner notification.

Nurse Treatments: for repeat cryotherapy (wart freezing, not 1st treatment, must have been seen in last 4 weeks), further vaccinations (not 1st dose). NOT for general symptomatic patients. At SFH only they can also do coil removals (NOT coil problems).

Complex LARC/complex contraception/complex PrEP/Recurrent/Skin/procedure/contraception problems – no direct booking from contact centre, but if patient calls to cancel please leave in appointment slot and email outpatient team with patient details to rebook like-for-like appointment. (These are at NCH/VHC only)

PrEP for repeat or starting PrEP (will also have an asymptomatic screen but no symptoms, not for those needing treatment for an STI) (NCH/VHC only)

Telemedicine results management clinics: Any patient who wants a discussion about something (e.g. questions about an STI diagnosis, questions about a method of contraception etc.)

F2F interpreters for **LARC appointments only:**

- Appointments at NUH – please add a **new task on Inform** – Task, Interpreter required, NUH task. Include the language required and appointment details in the notes box
- Appointments at SFH – **FOR SIGN LANGUAGE ONLY** (other languages are covered by telephone interpreting at SFH) please e-mail the SFH Admin team on sfh-tr.adminsexualhealth@nhs.net. Include the language required and appointment details in the notes box
- Appointments needing an interpreter are single slot, but max 1 per list to avoid the clinic over-running
- Please add an alert on Inform to say interpreter requested

Information about coils:

NB: hormone coils can be used for both contraception and non-contraception purposes (eg. for heavy bleeding/HRT cover). **If the woman has NO need for contraception, then she can NOT have her coil fitted in ISHS. If she needs her coil for both non-contraception AND contraception then that is OK.**
